Expected Behaviour for a child inside the church

rom beginning to end, God speaks about the importance of children through His word. It is our responsibility to bring them up in the manner God wants us to do. Therefore, how they behave in the church shall not be a matter of serious concern; on the other hand, how, they are taught to behave shall be our main concern.

In Matthew Chapter 18, Jesus says, "Unless you are converted and become as little children you will by no means enter the Kingdom of heaven." He said this because children are humble, honest, innocent and loving.

An often-quoted complaint heard from elders is that children do not behave properly during worship service. Parents try to quieten them by giving eatables and mobiles to play. Is this the right thing to do? Do you try to inculcate in them the favourable attitude to receive and comprehend the concept of worship? They are not capable of understanding our worship. The sermons do not suit them. So they turn to other things, an act, which we may call 'indiscipline'.

Attending church service is a significant informal form of education which brings an extensive behavioural change in children. Here it is to be noted that parents and elders have a formative influence on the child's behaviour. The other day I witnessed a parent asking his son to sit inside the church while the 'Wise parent' was standing outside. The human behaviour is very much a matter of stimuli and response. When worship language is alien to children their attention gets diverted. One cannot prescribe norms for behaviour of children when they are in church worship meant for grown-ups.

However, the children are very good observers. They catch the passion for worship by watching their parents and elders. They realise and learn from elders that church is a sacred place for sacred worship. They should imbibe the required sense of solemnity and awe. The concept of faith, worship and God is a primary lesson that children should get from parents and elders.


